



## 733 Top KCSE performers admitted to Equity's flagship leadership program

*Scholars complete induction in Nairobi as Equity deepens long-term investment in human capital under ARRP*

Equity Group Foundation (EGF) has admitted 733 of Kenya's top-performing 2025 KCSE candidates into its prestigious Equity Leaders Program (ELP), marking the start of a structured leadership journey that combines values-based formation, workplace exposure and long-term mentorship. The admission follows a week-long induction held in Nairobi, where the scholars, selected from over one million KCSE candidates, were immersed in leadership, professionalism, communication, service and personal development. The program is part of a deliberate strategy to build the human capital required to accelerate Africa's socio-economic transformation, aligned to the Africa Recovery and Resilience Plan (ARRP).

The 2026 cohort reflects a rigorous, merit-based selection anchored on academic excellence. The scholars include 337 *Wings to Fly* and *Elimu* scholars who attained Grades A and A-, 106 top boys and girls from every sub-county who scored Grade A (plain), and 290 top national scholars who earned Grade A with 84 points.

Speaking during the induction, Equity Group Managing Director & CEO and Executive Chairman of EGF, Dr. James Mwangi, challenged the scholars to treat the moment not only as recognition of achievement but

as a responsibility to lead with integrity and deliver results, noting that excellence creates opportunity but leadership is proved through discipline, character and the ability to consistently solve problems.

“Today is both a celebration and a call to responsibility. You earned your place here on

merit, but leadership is not a title you will get tomorrow—it is the discipline you demonstrate daily, the integrity you uphold when no one is watching, and the problems you choose to solve. Excellence opens the door; character and consistency are what will keep you there and make you worthy of trust” said Dr. Mwangi.

The induction featured engagements with leaders drawn from governance, academia, media and industry, reflecting Equity's view that leadership is strengthened through exposure to diverse perspectives and real-world decision-making. EGF Board Member Dr. Ruth Kagia engaged the scholars on leadership in complex environments, emphasizing resilience, strategy and purpose as essential tools for a generation stepping into a rapidly changing world.

The scholars also interacted with some of the country's most influential media leaders, underscoring the role of information, narrative and accountability in shaping societies. Mr. Andy Kagwa, Operations Editor at The Standard Group, addressed scholars on Africa's future, youth,

media and opportunity, while Dr. Joe Ageyo, Editor-in-Chief of Nation Media Group, challenged them to think about credibility, public trust and leadership. The media engagements were capped by Mr. Linus Kaikai, Editorial Director at Royal Media Services, who urged scholars to develop clarity of thought, courage of conviction and excellence in communication; skills that are non-negotiable for leaders across sectors.

The scholars also benefited from academic perspectives shared by Prof. XN Iraki of the University of Nairobi, who engaged them on discipline, performance and decision-making, anchoring leadership not only in ambition but in the habits required to sustain it.

ELP is designed as a clear pathway from early leadership formation to real-world experience, continued mentorship and long-term networks that shape alumni outcomes. Following the induction, scholars are proceeding to branch placements and a paid internship at Equity Bank, where they will gain hands-on exposure in a professional environment, learning customer

service, accountability, operational discipline and how institutional decisions affect everyday lives. Each scholar receives a monthly stipend of KSh50,000 during the internship period, which serves the dual purpose of transition support and a practical test of responsibility.

Beyond the internship, scholars continue to access mentorship and structured opportunities during university. Those pursuing global education pathways receive support through the College Counselling Program, which helps scholars pursue admissions and scholarships at leading global institutions, while those studying locally continue their growth through ELP University Chapters that provide peer networks, leadership activities and community engagement platforms.

### About Equity Leaders Program

Equity Leaders Program (ELP) is a long-term social impact investment implemented across the markets where Equity operates, built on the conviction that leadership quality shapes economic and social outcomes as surely as capital and infrastructure do. The Foundation's education interventions, spanning *Wings to Fly*, the *Elimu* Scholarship and leadership development through ELP, is positioned as a continuum that begins with access and culminates in capability.

Since inception, ELP has achieved measurable outcomes from past cohorts, including alumni advancing into high-impact careers across technology, finance, engineering, public service and healthcare, alongside entrepreneurs and innovators building solutions for African markets.

A visible example of talent translating into community outcomes is Equity Afya, a growing network expanding access to affordable, quality outpatient healthcare, demonstrating how leadership development can connect directly to service delivery and scalable solutions. Framed within ARRP, the 733 admissions reflect a broader ambition to prepare leaders for a fast-changing Africa; particularly as digital systems and Artificial Intelligence continue to reshape the future of work, competitiveness and opportunity. As the 2026 cohort transitions into branch placements and the next phases of the program, it is a reminder that leadership begins now, measured not by titles, but by choices: integrity, excellence, responsibility and service.

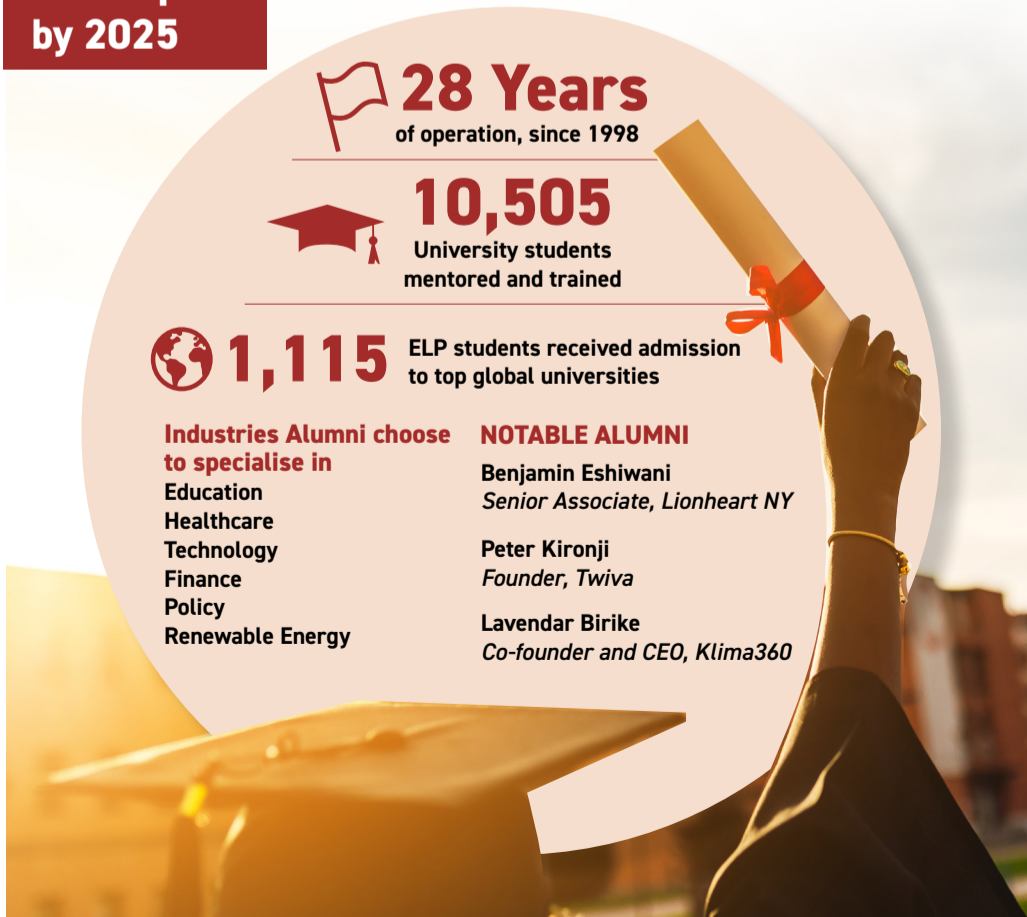

## Why Africa's transformation depends on human capital and why ELP matters now

Africa stands at a defining moment. We have the world's youngest population, rising ambition, and unprecedented connectivity. Yet we also face hard realities: the urgency of job creation, the need for stronger institutions, widening inequality, and a fast-moving technological revolution that will reward the prepared and marginalize the unready. In this environment, Africa's transformation will not be delivered by slogans or short-term interventions. It will be determined by the quality of leadership; and the depth of talent we deliberately build to lead across sectors and across borders.

That is why Equity Group Foundation invests in human capital as a long-term social impact investment, and why the Equity Leaders Program (ELP) sits at the center of that commitment. ELP is not a public relations story; it is a strategic response to a continental need. If leadership is the greatest constraint to development, then leadership development must become a deliberate and sustained national and regional priority. We must treat human capital the way we treat infrastructure: built early, built intentionally, and built at scale; because a society can only be as strong as the leaders who run its institutions, the professionals who deliver essential services, and the entrepreneurs who convert ideas into jobs.

ELP exists because excellence alone is not enough. Merit identifies potential; it does not guarantee outcomes. Talent without values is risk. Values without competence are ineffective. Africa's next phase of growth demands leaders

who can be trusted with power, resources, and influence; leaders who are disciplined, accountable, solution-oriented, and capable of delivering results consistently. It demands leaders who understand service: that leadership is not a title, but a daily choice to solve problems, to act with integrity, and to respect the dignity of every person. We want young leaders who understand how decisions affect lives, how trust is built, how systems serve people, and how professionalism

and communication shape outcomes. We also want leaders prepared for the future of work; where technology, data, and Artificial Intelligence are transforming economies and redefining competitiveness. Technology is not optional; it is essential. But it must be guided by values. Innovation without ethics can deepen inequality and weaken trust. Africa needs leaders who can build the future, and be trusted with it.

Our broader social impact

investment agenda, framed through the Africa Recovery and Resilience Plan (ARRP), is built on a simple conviction: Africa will rise when we build the capabilities of its people and connect those capabilities to real pathways of opportunity and impact. Human capital must feed enterprise. Enterprise must create jobs. Innovation must solve real problems. And leadership must translate into stronger institutions and better outcomes in health, education, finance, agriculture, and public service.

In that context, ELP is designed to do more than develop individuals. It builds a network, leaders connected across disciplines and borders, able to collaborate, exchange ideas, and multiply impact. This is how a continent transforms: not through isolated success stories, but through a critical mass of capable, values-driven leaders working together. It is also why ELP connects talent to impact pathways, including entrepreneurship and innovation, and initiatives such as Equity Afya; demonstrating what becomes possible when leadership development is tied to real solutions that improve lives at scale.

This is the long bet we are making on Africa: that when we deliberately invest in the best, equipping them with values, skills, exposure, and networks; they will return that investment by building what the continent needs next. The future belongs to those who are prepared. Our responsibility, as institutions, is to prepare Africa's leaders now; so that the Africa we want is not a dream, but a deliverable.

## MENTORS' VOICES

### Become authorities, multiply impact

Dr. Ruth Kagia encouraged the 2026 Equity ELP scholars to treat their admission into the program as a rare privilege, and a serious responsibility to lead with purpose, empathy and integrity.

She described the cohort as a special group whose performance reflects exceptional potential, noting that Equity is investing in them not only for their personal success, but because it believes they can become leaders of their communities, the country and the world

Dr. Kagia called on the scholars to pursue substance over status, encouraging them to

become the best in whichever fields they choose. "Substance matters. Become the authority," she urged, emphasizing that long-term influence is built on competence, credibility and consistent effort.

In a bold call to impact, she urged the 733 scholars to think beyond themselves and measure their success by the lives they change. She tasked each scholar to commit to meaningfully impacting at

least 100 people, so that decades from now others can point to them and say, "Because of you, I achieved this." She described the cohort as a vehicle for transformation, reminding them that the ELP journey is ultimately about service and social progress.

She also stressed that leadership requires more than knowledge: interpersonal and social skills, empathy, and the ability to work with people from different backgrounds are increasingly essential. She encouraged scholars to listen, observe and appreciate different perspectives, noting that intercultural understanding strengthens social cohesion and enables cooperation across communities and countries; specially in areas such as peacebuilding and climate action.

### Africa's transformation begins with the youth

Equity Bank Kenya Managing Director, Moses Nyabanda, called on the new ELP cohort to anchor their education and careers in purpose and meaningful impact.

"With this privilege comes responsibility; to grow, to lead, and to make a meaningful impact," he said.

He described the program as more than work experience, calling it "an apprenticeship in leadership" designed to prepare participants to lead their families, communities, workplaces, and beyond.

Nyabanda challenged the cohort to ask themselves, "Which problem in Africa will you solve?"

He emphasized that careers built on prestige alone do not leave legacies; true impact comes from addressing real challenges affecting people's day-to-day lives.



### Mastercard Foundation reaffirms commitment to champion education

The Mastercard Foundation has reaffirmed its unwavering commitment to championing access to education and job opportunities for young people in Kenya and Africa at large, especially those from underserved communities.

Through its Workforce Development Lead in Kenya, Anthony Karanja Kabiru, the Foundation has reiterated that it will continue to champion education reforms, making it responsive to the needs of the young people, leaving no one behind.

This will be achieved by partnering closely with governments, development agencies and private sector, including Equity and non-profit implementing foundation such as Equity Group Foundation, Karanja said in his address to the 2026 cohort of Equity Leaders Program (ELP) during their two-week induction in Nairobi.

"Our work entails supporting and strengthening collaborations in the education sector to ensure that education works for all. We guide policy dialogues and systems reforms with stakeholders to strengthen governance, financing and quality assurance in education," said Karanja, whose work sits at the intersection of education, skills and economic opportunity.

While congratulating the 733 scholars for making it to the coveted apprenticeship program, Karanja said he remains keen on shaping the future of Africa's young workforce with vision and purpose. He said, alongside partners like Equity and others, Mastercard Foundation has shared commitment to empower young people to thrive, anchored on skills development. In the spirit of championing youth opportunity, he shared nuggets of academic and life success to help ELP scholars thrive in Africa's skills and employment landscape.

"What you stand for should be non-negotiable. Peer pressure will test you and how you handle it will define who you are. Some of the key values you shouldn't compromise on to stay the course include; grounding yourself; raising standards by being disciplined; aligning your strengths and building strategic relationships," said Karanja, promising to continue guiding high-performing teams in the education

sector toward large-scale social impact.

He hailed the program, which since its establishment in 1998 has benefited 10,505 university scholars from Kenya, Uganda, Democratic Republic of the Congo and Rwanda. To date, a total of 1,115 students have successfully received admission to top global universities on fully funded scholarships; including Ivy League Universities such as Columbia University, Harvard University, Princeton University and University of Pennsylvania.

Karanja noted that life in college rewards discipline and urged the scholars to read widely, manage their money wisely, and protect their reputation. He encouraged them to stand for something and to become the change they wish to see.

"You are the change. Provide solutions. Don't just chase prestige, put in the long hours of sacrifice. Form strong partnerships because if you want to go fast, go alone; if you want to go far, go together," he said, urging the scholars to seek mentors to look up to for direction and to seize opportunities in life when they arise.

Karanja added that Mastercard Foundation remains committed to designing education-to-work pathways that respond to real industry needs, reduce skills mismatches and unlock dignified work opportunities for the youth. "The foundation's work will continue to champion equity and inclusion by expanding access to skills and employment for youth and other underserved communities," he said.

## NEWSMAKERS' VOICES

### Your background does not define your future, but your integrity will

Royal Media Services Group Editorial Director and Head of Strategy, Linus Kaikai, urged the newly admitted scholars to anchor their ambitions on integrity as they transition from induction into paid internships and structured mentorship within the Equity ecosystem.

Speaking during the induction in Nairobi, Kaikai cautioned the scholars that while academic excellence opens doors, it is character that sustains success, especially when pressure, temptation and public scrutiny come. He urged the cohort to view integrity not as a slogan, but as a personal discipline that must be practiced consistently in small decisions long before it is tested in big moments.

Drawing from his own journey, from a childhood in rural Trans Mara to leadership in one of the country's largest media organisations, Kaikai reminded the scholars that their beginnings do not limit their destinies. What matters most, he said, is the values they carry into every classroom, workplace and relationship.

"Your background does not define your future, but your integrity will," he said. "Integrity cannot be delegated. It is the honesty and moral uprightness you build within yourself before you can apply it professionally or academically. You cannot fake it and make it. When the pillars of personal, professional and academic integrity are weak, you risk collapsing under pressure."

### Lead boldly and leverage media and digital opportunities available

Operations Editor at the Standard Media Group, Andy Kagwa, urged scholars to lead with courage, create their own opportunities, and use media and technology responsibly as they prepare for their six-month branch placements across Equity Bank Kenya.

Speaking during the induction in Nairobi, Kagwa challenged the scholars to recognize that the world of work is changing fast, and that success will increasingly belong to those who can adapt, learn and create.

He walked the scholars through the realities of today's media landscape, describing it as an ecosystem with diverse roles beyond what most people see on the front page or on screen.

Drawing from his personal journey, from banking to journalism, and recalling formative experiences early in his career, Kagwa encouraged scholars to embrace every placement and assignment as a growth opportunity.

"Don't feel you've been thrown to rot; embrace every experience. When you are given a lemon, what do you do? You make lemonade," he said, urging them to maximize the opportunity Equity has placed in their hands. Kagwa also called on the

scholars to be intentional about their digital footprints, warning that online choices have long-term consequences. "Media is not just a channel; it's an ecosystem of information, identity, influence, and opportunity," he noted. "Consume what builds your skills and character, not the dirty stuff. The Internet never forgets, and your online presence will follow you for life."

### Supporting youth to access future-ready skills for the digital economy

Lady Marième Jamme, founder of iamtheCODE, urged African youth to seize opportunities in the rapidly evolving digital economy by acquiring future-ready skills such as artificial intelligence (AI), coding and data analytics.

Speaking to the 2026 cohort of Equity Leaders Program (ELP) scholars during their induction in Nairobi, the Senegalese-born tech entrepreneur challenged young people to embrace digital competencies, innovation and entrepreneurship to help position Africa as a competitive player in the global digital landscape.

"I believe deeply in African youth and in your limitless potential. Digital skills give you

the freedom to innovate and shape your future," she said, encouraging young people to remain consistent in their learning journey and use technology to build solutions that address societal challenges.

Lady Marième also encouraged the scholars to enroll on iamtheCODE's free digital learning platform, which offers a 12-week blended curriculum covering programming languages including HTML, CSS, JavaScript and Python.

She noted that the initiative has a strategic partnership with Equity Group Foundation aimed at empowering up to 600,000 learners across Africa with essential digital and technical skills to participate meaningfully in the continent's growing digital economy.

### Build on a stable foundation: health, integrity, roots and ambition

University of Nairobi lecturer Prof. XN Iraki encouraged scholars to view their admission into the program as more than recognition of academic excellence, urging them to build their futures on strong foundations, physical and mental wellbeing, integrity, meaningful relationships, and a clear sense of identity and purpose.

He urged them to reflect on what becomes possible "when opportunity meets preparation," emphasizing that success is not only about ambition, but about having the stability to pursue it. He illustrated this using environment such as leading global workplaces where basic needs are catered for, noting that when people are safe, fed and supported, they can focus on growth, creativity and self-realisation.

Prof. Iraki emphasized that health is their first asset, saying that without physical wellbeing, nutrition, fitness and self-care; academic and professional achievement becomes impossible. Adding that mental and emotional health are equally critical, especially at an age where peer pressure can shape choices. He also advised scholars to be intentional about friendships and networks, urging them to "test" relationships by asking who shows up in moments of need, not only during celebrations.

He stressed that integrity and relationships are central to long-term success, arguing that money is not the ultimate measure of achievement. "Your network, your mentors, and the people you impact matter," he noted, encouraging scholars to cultivate trust by being honest, dependable and consistent.

### Lead with character

Nation Media Group Editor-in-Chief Dr. Joe Ageyo (pictured) challenged the ELP scholars to anchor their leadership journeys on character, integrity and service, warning that competence may open doors but only strong values sustain influence.

Dr. Ageyo asked the scholars to look beyond their academic achievements and focus on the kind of people they are becoming. "Your grades got you here. But it is only your character that will keep your influence. The world will reward your competence, but only your character will sustain your influence," he told the scholars.

He encouraged the scholars to treat their careers as platforms for service rather than ladders for personal success, challenging them to contribute, mentor and make room

for others. "You must see yourself not as someone racing to succeed for the sake of it, but as someone preparing to provide a shoulder for the next generation," he said, noting that reputation is built daily, even when one is absent.

On the rapidly changing world of work, Dr. Ageyo emphasized adaptability and disciplined thinking, particularly in the age of Artificial Intelligence. "What got you here will not get you to the next level," he cautioned. "Use technology as a tool. Do not outsource your mind." He encouraged scholars to pursue substance over clout, insisting that true success is measured by impact, not titles. "Your true measure of success will not be the size of your office or the title you hold, but the size of your contribution to society," he said.

### Turning hardship into possibility

I was born in Moyale, where being a girl means learning resilience early. School was never just about books. It meant walking under the harsh sun, studying amid occasional insecurity, and knowing that many girls my age would leave class for marriage or because fees were unaffordable.

I began primary school in Moyale and studied there up to Class Four before moving to Nairobi to live with my sister. The transition was not easy. From the dusty northern border to Kiamaiko, and later Mihango, everything felt different. I joined Mihango Primary in Class Seven and scored 346 marks in KCPE.

Financially, I was meant to join a day school. Boarding school was beyond our reach.

When I heard about the Elimu scholarship, I chose to try. I knew what it meant for a girl from Moyale to be given a real chance. When I was selected, everything changed. Equity stepped in at a time when my path could easily have narrowed. I joined St. Angela Nguviu Girls Secondary School in Embu County and later scored an A- of 77 points in KCSE.

For me, being part of ELP 2026 scholar means another chance to better my life into a future leader. Through ELP, we have been exposed to and interacted with leaders who once stood where I stand now. I look forward to using the mentorship I have received to shape my life with intention and purpose. The six-month paid internship will prepare me mentally and financially, especially as I help support my siblings. Because of ELP, I feel prepared for responsibility and leadership.

### Preparation meets opportunity

I grew up in Rabai, Kilifi County, and like many students, I learned early that progress comes from consistency; showing up, studying, and believing that effort will count.

In 2021, the Covid-19 pandemic disrupted many livelihoods, and my family felt the impact. Still, I stayed committed to my KCPE preparation. When results came out, I scored 397 marks (A-), emerging among the top performers in Kilifi County. That performance earned me admission to Mang'u High School.

I joined Mang'u through the Wings to Fly scholarship program, supported by Equity Group Foundation, which opens opportunities

for learners from financially strained backgrounds who demonstrate strong academic promise. I remember coming to Nairobi for induction and meeting students from across the country. That experience widened my thinking. It showed me how much you can learn from people with different stories, and how community and mentorship can sharpen your goals.

At Mang'u, I embraced the full experience; academics, leadership, and personal growth. The mentorship sessions, school clubs, and congresses helped me build confidence, discipline, and communication skills.

In KCSE, I scored 77 points (A-). Today, as an ELP scholar, I'm looking ahead to pursue Pharmacy at a leading Kenyan university. I'm excited about the next steps: learning from mentors, gaining workplace exposure through internship, and building a strong network of fellow scholars.



### Walking miles, holding on to hope

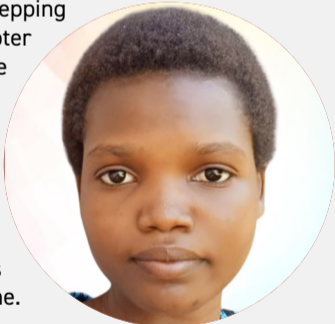
I come from Tiaty in Baringo County, and for a long time, school felt like something I had to fight for, day by day. I started at Cheptenoyo Primary School, about 10 kilometres from home. Walking that distance became normal.

When I was in Class Five, my father passed away, and around the same time my older sister became seriously ill. That moment stayed with me because it reminded me that one difficult season doesn't have to be the end of the story.

I scored 293 marks in KCPE, lower than I had hoped, and I worried about how I would transition to secondary school. When I learned about the Elimu Scholarship, I applied and completed the interview and home verification, though I later assumed I hadn't been selected. To my surprise, I received confirmation that I

had been awarded the scholarship. That support gave me the stability to focus on learning.

When I scored an A- in KCSE (2025) at Maron High School, it felt like a quiet victory; not just for me, but for my family, my teachers, and everyone who stood with me. Today, as an ELP scholar, I'm stepping into the next chapter with gratitude and courage; ready to keep learning, keep growing, and eventually use what I gain to support others coming behind me.



### I'm more than my starting point

Elimu Scholarship beneficiary and ELP 2026 scholar

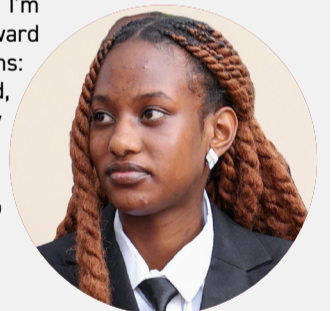
My family and I moved to Kenya from the DR Congo in 2015. I was nine years old, and school felt like a completely new world; new language, new curriculum, new routines. It took time to adjust, and there were moments I felt different, but I stayed focused.

I sat for KCPE at Mwangaza School in Nairobi and scored 403 marks, emerging top in my school. I was encouraged to apply for the Elimu Scholarship, which I did, and got selected. I joined Mbooni Girls High School in Makueni. The stability and mentorship I received allowed me to focus fully on learning and to grow in confidence.

While in form four, I received painful news from home: relatives in the DRC had been killed in the war there. It affected my

focus, but with support from my teachers, I found my footing again. When KCSE results were released, I scored A- (78 points).

Consequently, I was selected into the Equity Leaders Program (ELP). The ELP induction introduced me to a wider network of scholars and mentors, and helped me think about leadership as service, not status. I'm carrying forward three lessons: stay disciplined, protect my character, and use every opportunity to build skills.



### Carrying my mother's lessons forward

I grew up in Busia in a home where education was taken seriously. My mother raised my siblings and me with a steady message: work hard, stay grounded, and remember you have something to contribute. When she passed while I was in Class Six, my sister and I moved to Bungoma to live with our uncle, and I had to adjust quickly to a new home, a new school, and a new pace of life.

That season taught me resilience, but it also strengthened my focus. I kept my mother's words close and

treated school as a personal commitment. In KCPE, I scored 406 marks out of a possible 500.

Joining Nanyuki High School was another major step. I was able to take it up through the Elimu Scholarship, a Government of Kenya scholarship program implemented through the Equity Group Foundation. That support represented both opportunity and responsibility: the chance to grow, and the expectation that I would make the most of it. In KCSE, I scored 81 points (A plain).

Being selected into the 2026 ELP cohort feels like the next chapter of growth. The induction in Nairobi has expanded how I think about leadership, technology, and the future of work. I'm now drawn to Cyber Security and Digital Forensics, because I want to help build safer digital systems for institutions and communities.

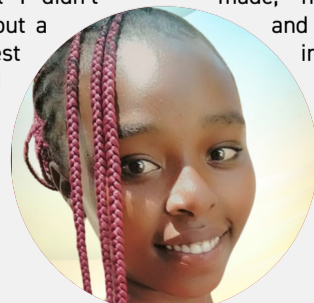
KCSE 2025 Top Female Student, Siaya County - ELP 2026 Scholar
